PROJECT SPOTLIGHT CHICAGO MAYORAL TRANSITION ACCELERATION

Given our flexible, collaborative model, Civic Consulting Alliance is uniquely positioned to capture unanticipated opportunities and address urgent challenges that advance our mission. Chicago's 2019 Mayoral transition was one such opportunity, as it was the first time a new Mayor would have just seven weeks to prepare to lead the City following the runoff election. Along with our *pro bono* partners, Civic Consulting Alliance supported the transition in three phases.

- **Pre-general election** (Fall 2018 February 26, 2019): We compiled a fact base of City departments and agencies, and strategic options across nine issue areas.
- **Runoff** (February 27 April 2, 2019): We worked with the nonpolitical transition teams of both runoff candidates, using our research to create detailed transition plans.
- **Transition** (April 3 May 20, 2019): We helped Mayor-elect Lori Lightfoot's team manage the entire transition program.

On May 20, 2019, Lightfoot took office as Chicago's 56th Mayor with a plan in place and input from diverse stakeholders in hand. Our contributions to the transition will impact not only the future of our city, but also our vision for Civic Consulting Alliance's work.
